AARP TAX AIDE - Free tax help (federal, state, and local) for taxpayers with low- and middle-income, with special attention to those age 60 and older, will be offered at the Library through the AARP Foundation, in conjunction with the IRS. Volunteers will be available in the Library Program Room (Terrace Level) **every Monday from 10:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. February 1 through April 12 (except February 15)**. Time slots are given on a first-come, first-served basis and are limited to 20 slots. You may sign up for a time slot the Monday morning of the free tax-aide beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the Library's lobby. All tax returns are E-Filed (electronic filing). No business returns are done.

LOVE BUGS - Valentine creations galore will highlight this program for children ages 7-12 years on **Saturday, February 6, from 2:00-3:30 p.m.** Learn a little history about the Victorian Valentine and design one of your very own. Join us in playing Valentine games. Create a Valentine bag and an edible flower to go in your bag. Also, Daisy, our Paws to Read Therapy Dog, will be joining us as we read loveable Valentine stories. BOOK DISCUSSION FOR ADULTS - Join us on **Monday, February 8, from 6:00-8:00 p.m.** as we discuss *Song Yet Sung* by James McBride. This story, set in Maryland in the 1850s, begins with Liz, a slave called "The Dreamer" because she can see into the future. Liz is captured with many slaves and, while captured, learns about the Code from an older woman. Liz frees herself and the other slaves and the story to find Liz begins - with slave catchers and other slaves who unveil the Code to her. Sandy Zagarell of Oberlin College will be the discussion leader. *You can register and pick up a copy or a recording of the book at the Reader's Advisory Desk. (Please Note: It is not necessary to read the book to attend the discussion.)* Book Discussions are held in the Library Program Room.
