We are hosting a new reading and discussion series titled *Let's Talk About It: Making Sense of the American Civil War*. Participants will learn about the legacy of the Civil War and emancipation through both historical and contemporary literature, and discuss these works in scholar-led discussions. Our first discussion will be held on **Monday, February 13, at 6:30 p.m.** with discussion leader Sandy Zagarell of Oberlin College. The theme for this discussion is *Imagining War* and the novel will be *March*, which imagines our way into the Civil War, including a brief selection of Louisa May Alcott's journal of her experience as a Civil War Nurse. Hayes Presidential Center, will show you the tools needed to explore the genealogy of a house. She will explain how to use printed and online sources to track down the owners and history of a property through deeds, Sanborn Maps, city directories, tax records, and other sources. *Registration is requested.*

BEGINNING SPANISH (for grades 1-5) - Give your child the fun experience of learning a new language. Ana Sanchez will introduce children in grades 1-5 to the art of learning Spanish. This class will be held on **Saturdays, February 4, 11, 18, 25, and March 3 at 11:00 a.m.** *Registration is required.*

AARP TAX-AIDE - **Mondays, Feb. 6 - April 9, 10:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m.** FREE tax help (federal, state, and local) for taxpayers with low- and middle-incomes, with special attention to those age 60 and older. Bring your Social Security card and your 2010 return. Time slots are given on a first-come, first-served basis and are limited to 20 slots. You may sign up for a time slot the Monday morning of the free tax-aide beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the Library's lobby. All tax returns are e-Filed (electronic filing). No business, clergy, or rental property returns are done.

TECH TALK TUESDAY - Join us for an hour discussion on various social media topics. Basic computer knowledge is recommended. On **February 7, at 1:00 p.m.** the topic will be Facebook for Novice Users.

TWEEN BOOK CLUB - The first Tuesday of the month from **3:30-5:00 p.m.** On **February 7**, we will discuss *Diary of a Wimpy Kid* by Jeff Kinney and *Dork Diaries* by Rachel Renee Russell. This Book Club is for grades 3-6 who want to discuss really cool books while hanging out and doing fun activities! To pick up a copy of the book, stop at the Reader's Advisory Desk.

DICKENS IN OHIO - On April 1, 1842, Charles Dickens embarked on a trip down the Ohio River. He traveled from Cincinnati to Columbus by coach, and then throughout Ohio, stopping in Sandusky at one point. Join us **Tuesday, February 7, at 6:30 p.m.**, on the anniversary of Dickens' 200th birthday, as actor and historical impersonator Roger Jerome presents "Dickens in Ohio." *Registration is not required.*

BROWN BAG LUNCH: THE REBUILDING OF THE WHITE HOUSE - **Wednesday, February 15, from 12:00-1:00 p.m.** Local historian Jim Miller will explore the 1952 renovation of the White House. Most people know that the White House was a target for destruction on 9/11, but many don't know the building was almost lost in the late 1940s as a victim of structural neglect. This program explores the events leading up to and the eventual reconstruction of the White House.

DIGITAL HISTORY: SANDUSKY'S STORY ONLINE - On **Saturday, February 18, at 2:30 p.m.** learn about local history resources on the internet. Archives Librarian Ron Davidson will give an overview of primary and secondary sources covering the history of Sandusky and Ohio that are freely available online. See views of original documents of Sandusky history from the 19th and 20th centuries (and some from even earlier!) that are presented on websites such as *Ohio Memory, Cleveland Memory, and Google Books*. Discover more about these sources and their history. You will learn about ongoing digital history projects at the Library, including the *Sandusky History Blog* and an online database of archival collections. *Registration is requested.*

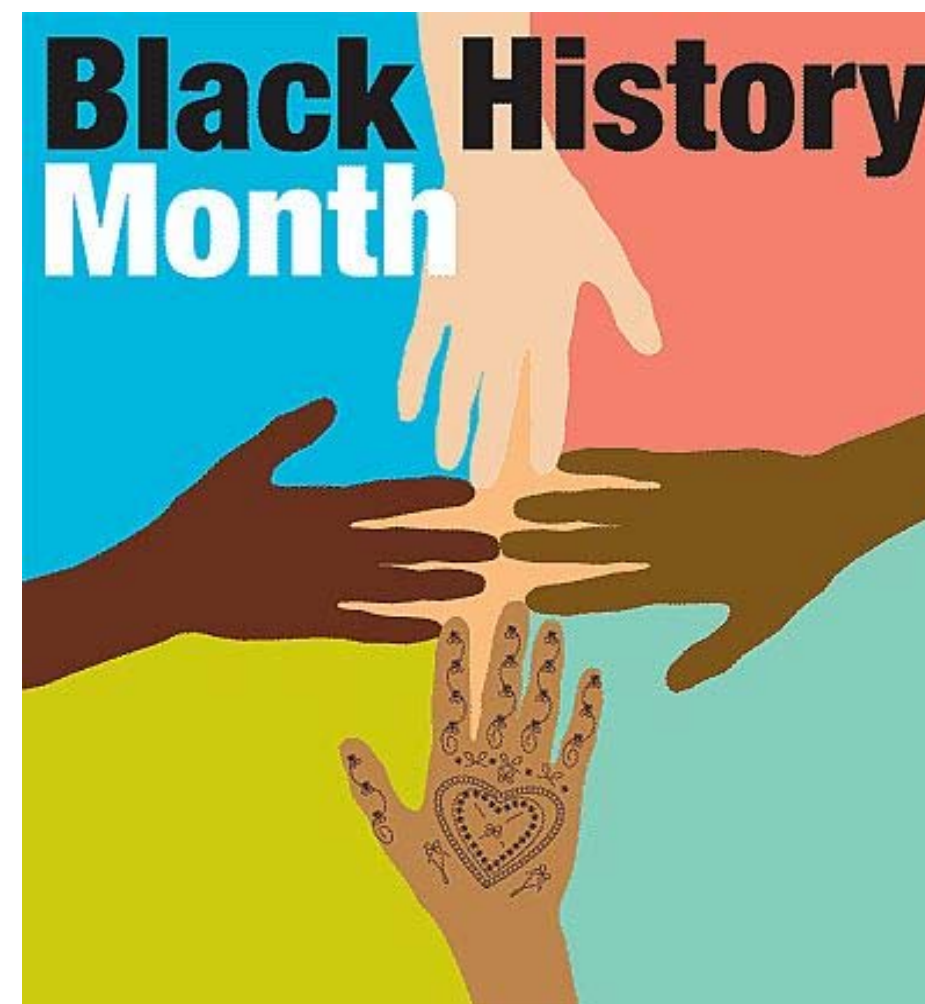
