Terrorizing Immigrants and Catholics: The Ohio Ku Klux Klan in the 1920s Saturday, February 3, at 2:00 p.m.

William Trollinger, PhD, Professor, History and Religious Studies, University of Dayton, presenter

The Ku Klux Klan exploded in the early 1920s, targeting immigrants, Jews, and Catholics. In this presentation we will explore why the Klan was so strong in Ohio, what activities the Ohio Klan were engaged in, and in what ways the folks targeted by the Klan fought back.
