HOW TO PARTICIPATE:

Use your Reading Log to keep track of the amount of time that you read or listen to a book along with special activities that you can participate in during June and July. You can earn one prize ticket per hour of reading (maximum of 10) and one prize ticket for each activity (maximum of 10) that you complete. Prize tickets can be placed in the prize box of your choice for a chance to win. Bonus tickets can be earned for each program you attend. Bring your completed Reading Log to the Library for a yard sign.
